

Indefinite pronouns

Indefinite pronouns are used to refer to an object or person that is unknown to the speaker.



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	some	any	no	every
People	someone somebody	anyone anybody	no one nobody	everyone everybody
Things	something	anything	nothing	everything
Place	somewhere	anywhere	nowhere	everywhere

Every



It refers to all members of a group. It's used in **affirmative** sentences.

- Every is another word for **all**.
- Everyone = **all** people
- Everything = **all** things
- Everybody = **all** people
- Everybody = Everyone
- Everywhere = **all** places

EXAMPLES

Everybody knows Shaggy is a coward guy.

Todo el mundo sabe que shaggy es un chico cobarde.



EXAMPLES

Now, you have *everything* you need.

Ahora, tu tienes todo lo que necesitas.



EXAMPLES

It's so messy in here! There are clothes *everywhere*.

Esta muy desordenado aquí. Hay ropa en todas partes



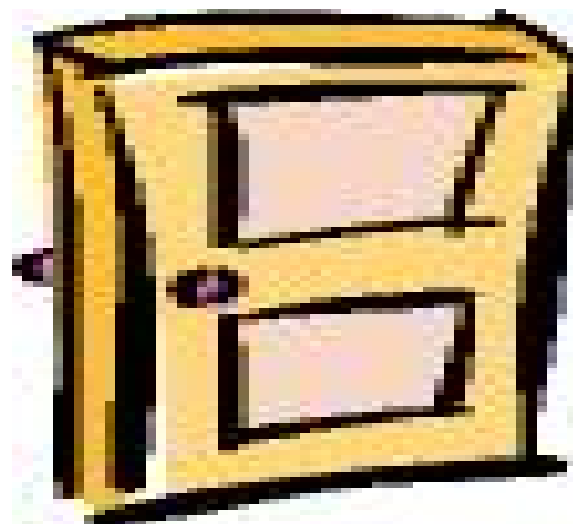
Some

It refers to one person, thing or one part of a group.
It's used in affirmative sentences.

- An unspecified amount or number of.
- Someone / Somebody = unspecified amount or number of people.
- Something = unspecified amount or number of things.
- Somewhere = unspecified amount or number of places.

EXAMPLES

Someone is knocking on the door.
Alguien esta tocando la puerta



EXAMPLES

I want to tell you *something*.
Quiero decirte algo



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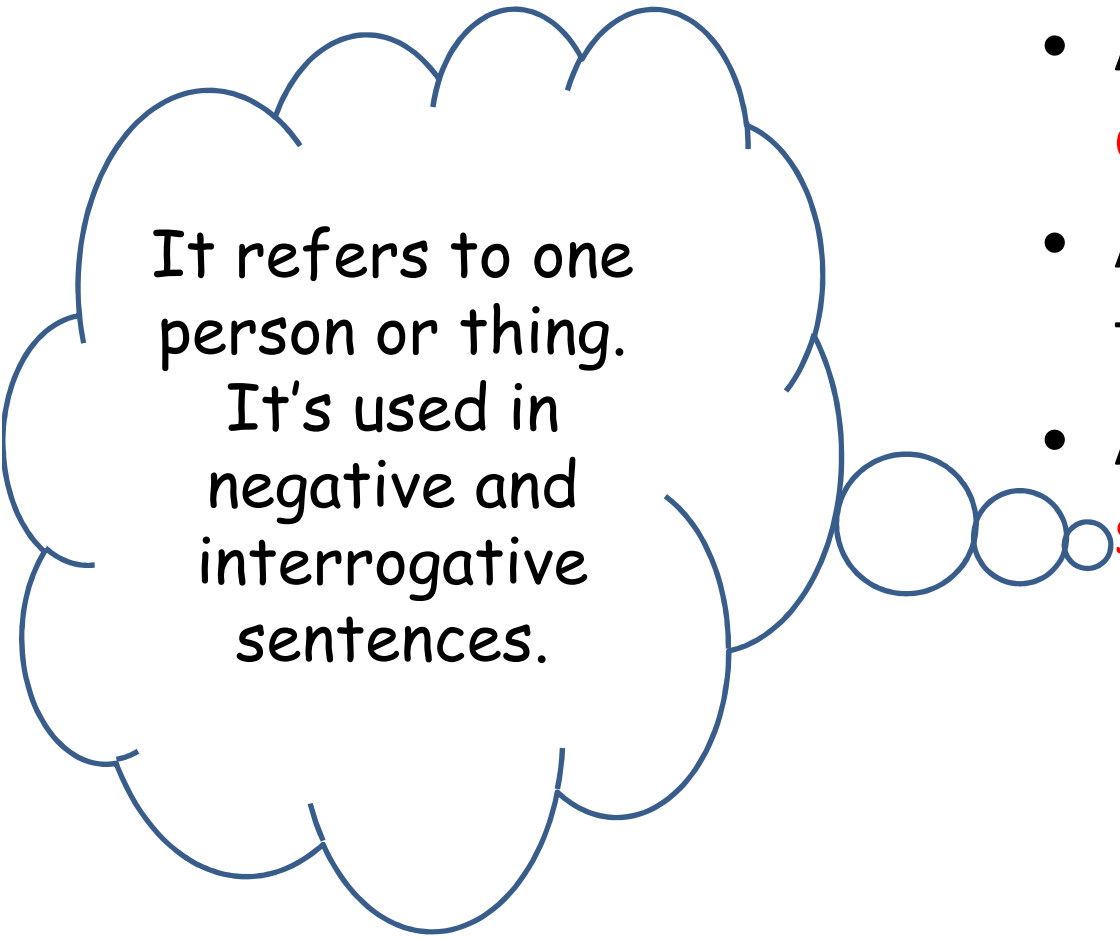
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EXAMPLES

My keys must be *somewhere*.
*Mis llaves deben estar en
algún lado*



Any

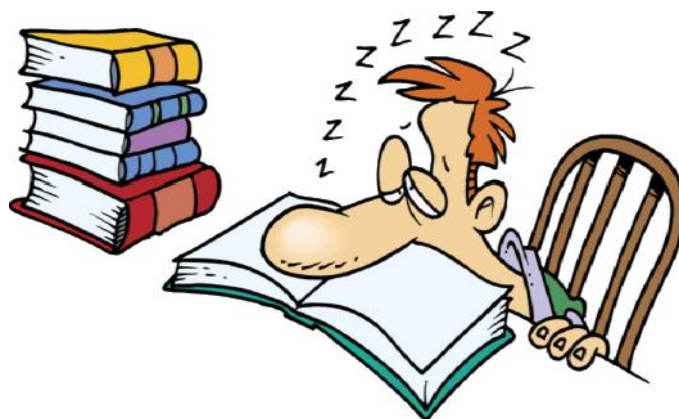


It refers to one person or thing.
It's used in negative and interrogative sentences.

- Anyone / Anybody = **one or some** people.
- Anything = **one or some** things.
- Anywhere = **one or some** places.

EXAMPLES

Is there *anyone* who can help me?
Hay alguien que pueda ayudarme?



EXAMPLES

Sorry, but we can't do *anything* for you.

Lo siento pero nosotros no podemos hacer nada por ti



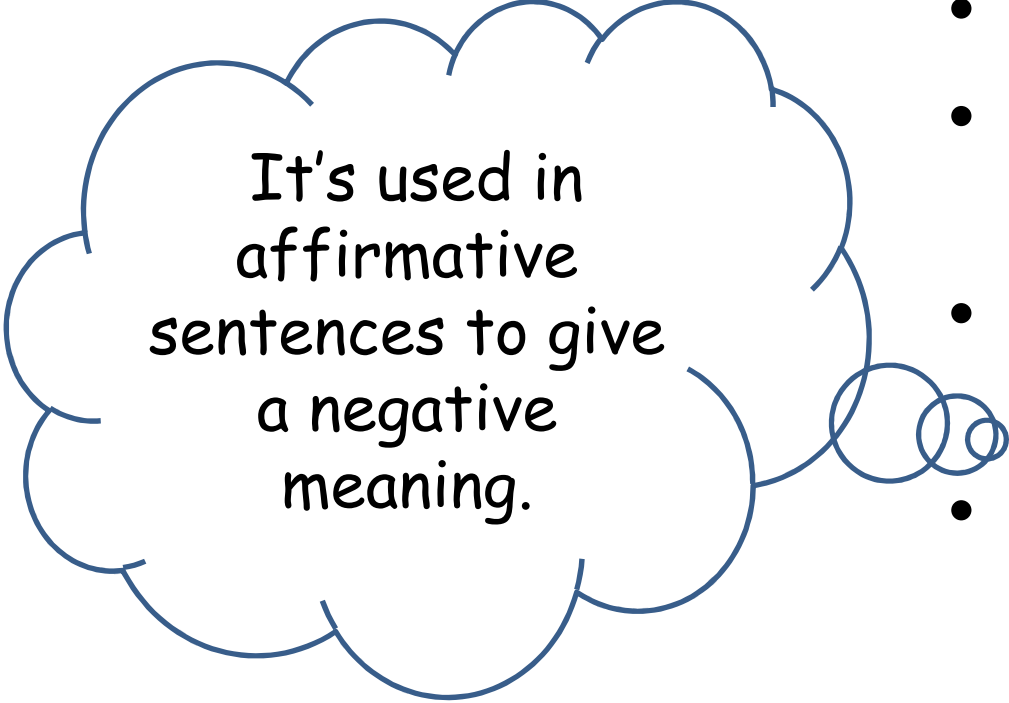
EXAMPLES

There are so many people. You can't sit
anywhere.

Hay muchas personas. Tu no te puedes
sentar en ningun lado



No-



It's used in affirmative sentences to give a negative meaning.

- None = **Not any**
- No one / Nobody = **Not any** person.
- Nothing = **Not any** thing.
- Nowhere = **Not any** place.

EXAMPLES

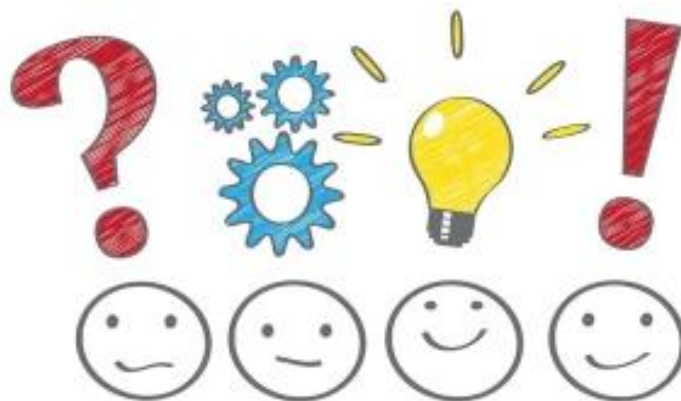
I'm not wearing my glasses. I can
see *nothing*.

No estoy usando mis gafas. Veo nada



EXAMPLES

Nobody could answer the questions
Nadie pudo responder las preguntas



EXAMPLES

Nowhere is safe.
Ningun lado es seguro





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
